# Captains Report 2016

Welcome everyone to this year's Annual General Meeting and Presentation night for 2016.

It again has been a busy and exciting year for the club:

- we hosted another successful Bank Holiday at Stonecutters,
- we again sent teams to the RS Elliott and Interbank and had success coming back again with some major trophies
- and probably our biggest effort was the launching of the club's website. (since the site's launch in March this year, we have had over 7700 hits on the site....not too bad!)
- Also relating to the website, we were able to fill in missing details on the history of the club's Henry & Long trophy. As you all probably know, we managed to track down Les Henry earlier this year who presented the Henry & Long trophy to the Scratch Club Championship winner Jack Brown back in 1956. We did invite him to the AGM hoping he would be able to present the trophy again 60 years later...unfortunately he was unable to attend tonight but looking at the bigger picture, we were able to complete the club's trophy history.

### Okay let's warm up with some stats for the 2016;

Average attendance at this year's 13 regular events was 34 (which was pretty much the same as 2015 at 33.2). We had a high of 42 players at "Royal" Glenmore and low of 22 at The Links Shellcove.

# Looking forward to next year's games....

There will be a few changes for 2017 schedule. The first game of the year will be at Eastlakes GC on 8<sup>th</sup> January. During August and due to popular

demand (well lack of demand), we have finally replaced The Links Shellcove with Bayview GC (apologies to the Shire people). The September game will still see us out west at Camden GC.

Well done to The Mouse again for another outstanding job in booking the games. Also....The Mouse will be hanging up his booking officer boots this year so I would also like to congratulate The Mouse again on a great job he has done over the last 4 x years as booking officer.

**Fixture cards.....** with the launch of the club's website early this year, we have decided to stop printing the blue fixture cards. ## Matchplay

**RS Elliott** - This year's RS Elliott tournament was hosted in Melbourne at the 13<sup>th</sup> Beach Creek Course and Beach Course.

Monday's game was held at Creek course with The Managing Director's trophy won by the NSW team with an average team score of 34.2 stableford points. 2<sup>nd</sup> was Tas with 32.5 with SA coming in 3<sup>rd</sup> with 31.7

Highlights from the NSW's team on the Monday was Richard Mair with 39 points and myself with 38 points, Stephen McCammond with 37 points and Allen Kenny with 36 points. With the other scores from the NSW team being 30 and above, it was going to be hard to beat.

On the Tuesday, the RS Elliott was held on the Beach course. The NSW and SA team tied for the RS Elliott trophy with a score of 460 strokes each. The Brisbane Salver trophy was won by the SA team with 205 points.

The Melbourne Cup was won by our Lloyd Rodger with 85 strokes while runner up was also another NSW player Simon Cooper with 86 strokes. The

Gateway Cup (best stableford score on Tuesday) was won by Ashley Jennings with 33 stableford points. Well done to the whole 2016 Elliott team.

The 2017 RS Elliott tournament will be hosted by Tasmania during the 12<sup>th</sup> to 15<sup>th</sup> of March next year and will be played at the Tasmania GC on Monday and Royal Hobart GC on the Tuesday. Accommodation will be at the Wrest Point Casino. Tasmania has requested for final details by 31<sup>st</sup> December.

The players that will be joining Warren Francis to represent NSW next year will be announced shortly.
