Comments on the forecast are –

- Bank Holiday was an outstanding success both event wise and financially delivering a result that was some \$2400 greater than last year
- Interest Income includes the late recognition of term deposit interest from last financial year of \$350.
- Lower participation in both the Westpac Challenge and Coffs Harbour at 12 and 15 players respectively will reduce projected club subsidies by \$200 and \$400 respectively

- As a consequence of club fixture cancellations due to weather, Captains Cash surplus is likely to come in some \$600 less than last year
- All in all a forecast breakeven result is considered favourably especially given the decision to lower our accumulated surplus through fixture subsidies, rule card distribution

GE has done some research re potential trips away as per attached quotations from Cobram Barooga, Airtree Resort and The Travelling Golfer summarized on the attached spreadsheet.

All are for potential trips away in the late March/early April period of 2025 in the Murray River region.

General consensus was that the quotation from The Travelling Golfer looked preferable including RACV Cobram Resort accommodation and 4 games of golf spread over 6 days as follows:

Day 1 - Travel

Day 2 - Golf @ Yarrawonga/Mulwala

Day 3 - Golf @ Tocumwal

Day 4 – Free day

Day 5 - Golf @ Black Bull

Day 6 - Golf @ Cobram Barooga

Cost - \$715 pp.

GE pointed out that there is an existing arranged tour to Barnbougle Dunes by Jeff Cashman's tour entity. He also advised that indicative numbers are critical and that it was appropriate to gauge membership interest and get a financial commitment asap.

It was agreed that the proposed timing of a tour is appropriate and before it gets unacceptably cold in the Murray region.

GE has drawn up a draft email to club membership and will amend before providing to the Secretary for distribution to members.

GF raised aspect of partners travelling as part of tour and GE was confident this could be accommodated.

The Committee thanked GE for his work on this matter to date.

22/8/23	Electronic scoring	MP	22/8/23 MP to explore options available for electronic scoring eg; MiScore 5/10/23 CFwd to 1/2024 8/2/24 RudiM gave a rundown of MiScore costing. \$20 pa pp to download app. If you are a member of a club with MiScore it is free. If not,it is a cost of \$19.57 pa pp. We can set up a comp for up to 50 players with live leaderboard, updated by individual players/markers. MiScore does not create tee times and does not do cross checking of scores. 14 day fee trial available and Rudi to test on an upcoming trip. GF advised MiScore is used by Vets but cost included in Vets fees. Vets have 100-120 players per event. Consensus is that there is potential to use MiScore. Cost for club to set up to be explored by MV. GolfPad could still be used for booking etc. 18/4/24 No action on this item since last meeting. RudiM advised that MiScore was not used on his recent golf trip as expected. MV asked whether it is appropriate to poll membership re use of MiScore including potential subsidy of member costs. General consensus no need. Further general discussion held on use of MiScore. RudiiM questioned whether there was a seamless link between MiScore and GolfLink. GF confirmed his understanding that the events are set up in MiScore which picks up Golflink handicap and at the end of the event info is fed back into GolfLink. He also understands that it does the clac including countbacks etc. GF to find out more detail on how it is used in the Veterans events. CFwd to next meeting. 13/6/24 - GF still to investigate details of Veterans use of MiScore MP advises super easy to use and considers it worthwhile At some point we will need to consider whether club will subsidise cost MP suggested cost \$19 pp be added to club membership WF also pointed out efficiency of MiScore scoring at club games. 22/8/24 GF advised: - New MiScore app being trialed and will be available late 24 aimed more at social clubs with more beneficial costs. Vete tide us with Mostane though by Sudale late costs.

MP asked about stock of existing club shirtson hand \$675. GE advised that he accrues/suspenses cost of shirts and that there are 11 left. GF suggested sell off for \$20 each. GE suggested there might be some resistance to buying new shirts and that we need to decide on level of shirt subsidy if any. GF will do further investigation & Committee members to look at the

		 Limited feedback received from his email re different shirt options. Preferred supplier does caps as well as shirts and will do a cap/shirt package for \$51.70 plus one off set up fee of \$60 plus shipping \$100.
		GE asked as to numbers required so that potential subsidy can be assessed. Looking at approx. 30 players which would be a \$1600 approx cost on a fully subsidized basis.
		RudiM asked why only 30 would get shirt if fully subsidized and given approx 43 different players have played games this year? Agreement that shirts be offered to players as they attend games.
		General agreement that: - White shirt with dark blue highlights is preferred and that existing logo be maintained. - Old stock to be given away/written off. GE pointed out that this would add to subsidy cost.
		GF to arrange for samples, ideally a S, M, L & XL to be provided for perusal at upcoming game.

		 Lynwood (23rd June) now 11.30 hit off. MP advised still under water so big chance game will not go ahead. Some members have complained about condition of Glenmore over the last 2 years. GF to look at alternatives for Lynwood this year and for future Glenmore games. Camden have put up their green fees from \$45 to \$50.

- GF has started looking at 2026 courses.
- Carnarvon suggested but unsure of their current approach re social clubs.
- Liverpool out of action for a couple of years but GE advised also some issues re the DA for the course renos.
- Shell Cove raised as an option but distance prohibitive.
- Long Reef also have put fees up to \$88. SC raised level of subsidy needs to be decided.

GF has requested Committee members consider other course options and advise him of suggestions.

GE mentioned Shellharbour but acknowledged distance prohibitive.

GF mentioned change of date to 20th October for Long reef this year given clash with their Club Championships.

Consensus that given full calendar for 2025 action item be closed off.

9. Correspondence – DMc

14/8/24 – Email from Peter Bendeich re MatchPlay:

" For some time I have been wanting to propose some changes to the current Match Play format.

* Currently we have 16 players qualify for spots to play on in designated rounds at the club's roster of games in a knockout format over 2 rounds then semi finals then final.

NB - The rules of golf in part state - Match Play events should not be played in conjunction with Stableford events - we have always ignored this to suit ourselves.

* Current policy is that if you know you are unable to play in any of the knockout rounds after qualifying you must declare yourself unavailable for the entire year and the Captain appoints another player in your place.

After playing well in the qualifying rounds you are then essentially disqualified from the entire season of Match Play because you may miss one game through no fault of yours Eg family commitments/away for weekend/ holidays etc

I propose the following change in format :-

- * Qualification to remain in the current format 16 players.
- * After the draw is completed, the 16 players then arrange amongst themselves a mutually convenient "neutral" course and time to play against their opponent in a strictly Match Play format. (ie no Stableford)

They would be given a time frame to complete their match in accordance with the clubs calendar of events during the year.

Any other qualifying golfers can make up a 4 if desired.

Results of each match then to be conveyed to the Captain for publication and next round compiled with designated cut off time nominated.

Matches can be played on any day of the week.

General discussion held and consensus was that:

- Playing Matchplay games outside of normal club rounds is not viable.
- Up to individual MatchPlay qualifiers as to whether they play matches or not and that they <u>are not</u> to be asked to withdraw before the MatchPlay tournament starts if there is a chance they will not be able to play each round.

GE pointed out the difference between MatchPlay rules (eg; concessions etc) and SFord and how it is not possible to play pure MatchPlay within a SFord comp. It was agreed that if MatchPlay was played outside of normal club games by arrangement there could not be any concessions.

SC also considered that if MatchPlay is played outside of club games then there would be an impact on President's Trophy.

GE suggested a compromise by where necessary playing scheduled MatchPlay games in normal club games that were not scheduled Matchplay rounds but again consensus was that this was logistically difficult.

DMc to draft a response for SC to provide to Peter Bendeich.

10. General Business – DMc

Bank Holiday Review (Cabramatta GC)

- Consensus was that overall it was a very successful and well attended day with course in very good condition.
- Catering was considered satisfactory.
- SC raised point that carts could have been better organized and better labelled. Not having names on carts made it difficult for some players. Carts were parked at various places so some confusion occurred.
- Noted that majority of the prize winners were from outside of our club.
- Course has been re-booked for 2025.
- A lower number of scoring errors compared to last year but BF advised that unless scores were 30+ cards were not really looked at.
- Some contention around Veterans events with confusion as to open Drive & Pitch event eligibility so this needs to be made clear for next year.
